A pillar of Europe's social model

- Social partnership has a strong institutional recognition anchored in the Treaty of the Functioning of the EU
 - Compulsory two-stage consultation ahead of European Commission's proposals in the social policy field
 - Recognised EU social partners can directly **influence legislative initiatives**
- Social partners can negotiate on agreements that can be transposed into EU Directives


EU funding

- 2021 calls on new E-grants platform

- Framework Agreement on Digitalisation (2020)


Agreements implemented as Council Directives

European Pillar of Social Rights

Twenty principles proclaimed in 2017. Three Chapters: equal opportunities & access to the labour market; fair working conditions; social protection & inclusion


Action plan on the European Pillar of Social Rights: concrete initiatives to deliver the Pillar (adopted March 2021)

Promoting Health and Occupational Safety and Health at Work	Social Dialogue
New OSH Strategic Framework 2021-27 Propose new tools to better measure barriers and gaps in access to healthcare	New award for innovative social dialogue practices
Present an EU report on access to essential services	Information and visiting programme for young future social partner leaders
Encourages Member States to invest in health workforce, improving working conditions and access to training	Review of sectoral social dialogue at EU level
Encourages Member States to boost the digitalisation of their health systems	New supporting frame for social partner agreements at EU level
