<u>Webinar 5</u>: Protection and compensation of victims and sanctions against perpetrators of violence and harassment

4 March 2022 - 10:00-12:30 CET, online

<u>Content</u>: The webinar will examine best ways to protect and compensate victims of violence and harassment and the extent to which support services are in place. The multisectoral Guidelines to tackle third-party violence and harassment at work adopted in 2010 (in 2018 by central government social partners) are available <u>here</u> in 21 languages. They recommend a holistic approach including support for victims and follow-up as well as involvement of workers and trade union representatives. We will discuss recent initiatives at national level and gather further views on how effective the Guidelines have been at national level and areas for improvement.
